





The last committee to present their report was the Committee on Global Partnership aka MDG 8. They felt the responsibility, yet were very excited to share their thoughts and ideas with others. Kaspars Briskens (LV), Jovan Cenev (MK) and Alexander Shlyk (BY) were the ones delegated by the committee to make the presentation, the result of their work, to explain the reason why they all came to the NEYF.

Kaspars (LV) explained the "philosophy behind the words". He admitted that the committee set a pragmatic blueprint on the problems they discussed. However, they made it possible to analyse economic questions and the question of youth employment. This delegate clarified that while achieving the 8th Millennium Development Goal, rich countries should not only financially support poor countries but should also assist poor countries help themselves. And there is no doubt that everyone present at the Plenary Session considered this idea as one of the basic. the one that should be considered while achieving all 8 Millennium Development Goals.

Jovan (MK) urged his "brothers and sisters" not only to read but also ... to understand the Committee Report. He was willing to explain every point in it as his Committee has spent much time calculating different indicators in order to create a report based on real facts, figures and efficient analysis. He called everybody upon "not asking themselves what the report can do for them, but what they can do for the report".

Alex (BY) was honoured to explain some of the main points of the paper. He stressed on the main points that could have been contradictory.

After the short presentation the Committee on MDG 8 had a chance to answer the questions. By answering the question asked by Oxana (UA), Vera (RU) made it clear to everyone that if they propose to employ talented people it has nothing to do with ,"brain drain". Thanks to the question asked by Sergej (UA), Kaspars(LV) was able to explain to everybody present on the Plenary Session the idea of providing financial aid to the



countries, only if the donor countries could rely on trust and transparency. Receiving financial aid commits a country to good governance, development of the economy and poverty reduction. Besides that delegates would like the open trading to develop further and become rulebased and non-discriminatory, open to all the countries.


Moreover, the idea of encouraging young people to develop clear innovative, workable plans was introduced. Representing the youth, the Committee on MDG 8 is sure that not even politicians, but young people could be the ones changing the world, making it better for the sake of mankind.

The Draft Project on the International Idea Contest on development co-operation was introduced, as it seeks to create a constant flow of innovative ideas in those fields and to offer young people a real chance to have their innovative ideas implemented by the UN. The main idea of the project is to involve the brightest and most active youth who have ambition to develop and seek implementation for their ideas.

The Committee on Global Partnership was congratulated by other delegates for the outstanding report. Everyone appreciated the work the committee has done. It has proved that development cooperation between countries of the world can be extremely fruitful. No one doubts now that the true benefits of development co-operation emerge in a genuine dialogue, where there is no room for political intrigues and narrow economic interest – and that is the goal the UN should strive for.

The last day of the Northern European Youth Forum.

The plenary session. Today we are finishing the work which we have been doing all this week. The discussion between the MDG groups is an opportunity to hear other opinions about our topics. We were creating plans for creating global primary education, but always there is an opportunity that we have not noticed something. Everybody is reading their reports and then the questions are following. Each group gets ten minutes for presenting his report and plans how to reach the goal which was given at the start of the forum.

Magnus and Nele are reading the report. We have to answer to given questions. The questions were:

Question: How are you going to improve whole education with mass media? Answer: No answer followed.

Q: Why do people of Africa need primary education? They even don't have jobs.

A: Why don't? Why do you need education? Are you different? Are African people different?

Q: Why you have written to decrease, but not to eliminate the illiteracy?

A: There is no opportunity to eliminate the illiteracy at all, there is no opportunity to eliminate anything at all, because we will always have people who don't agree with the rules of the society. That's why we wrote "eliminate".

Q: You are talking about volunteers who will go to Africa? Does anyone of you want to go to Africa and teach African people?

A (Nele): Yes, I can go.

Q: You are talking about very big things, but what we 140 delegates of NEYF can do?

A: We can go like a volunteers to Africa to teach African people.

After presenting the report we were listening to other presentations which were not very official, but everybody enjoyed it.

The discussion between the members of the committee which took place after the plenary session was not very hot, because the report which was written was quite good. The main thing which we were really interested in was learning through Mass Media. We didn't know that in Africa there is such shortage of Mass Media channels. them have access to television. They only have one newspaper in the whole country which is being published once a week. So we decided that learning through the Mass Media is very hard or even impossible, although there was first decided to try establishing educational broadcasting. The final report of goal: achieving primary education, wasn't changed a lot. We will try to decrease racial and ethnic discrimination to a minimum with the vision of completely eliminating it. The additional money which will be needed for funding the educational program can be found through fundraising. The materials for learning and teaching must be in the learners' native language and should be published on the spot at the lowest possible price.

The final report was completely agreed to by all members of the group and was presented for the community.
