VILNIUS 2003 - EYP REGIONAL SESSION

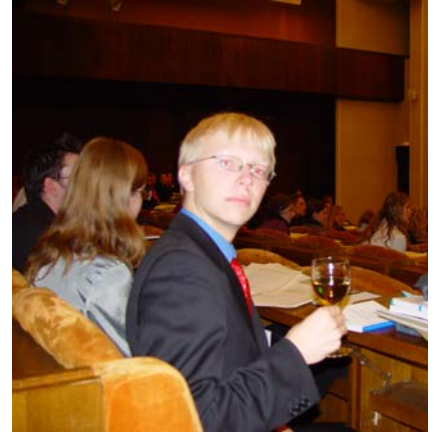

- I think we have some rules in Lithuania about fishing and hunting.

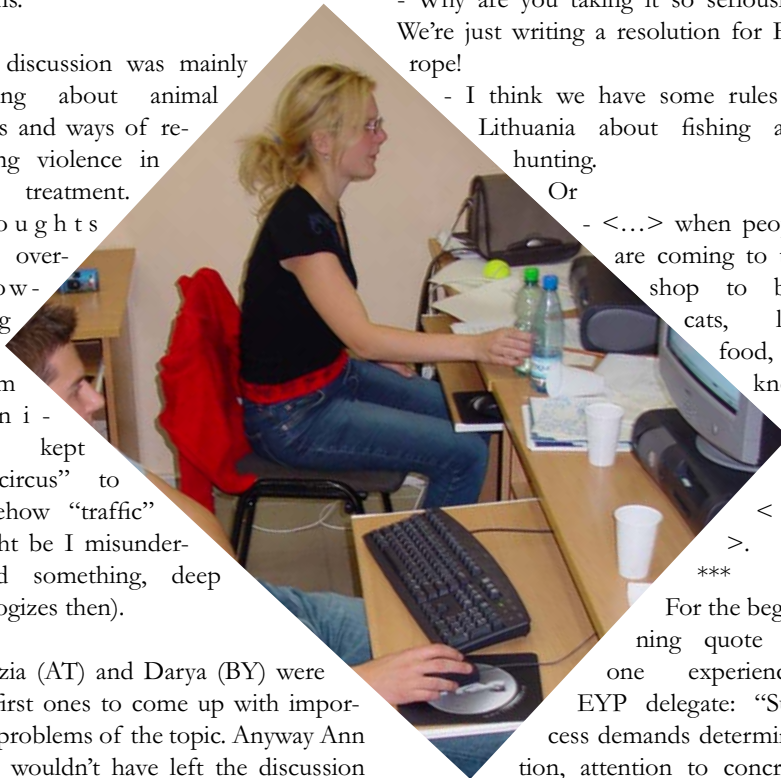

could say was: "Don't worry, they're really great, they'll manage"

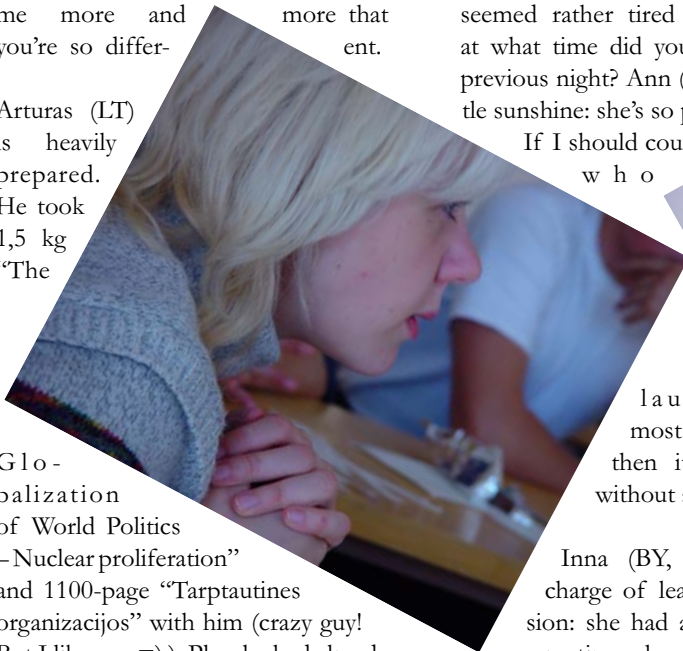
What I liked most of all, is the fact, that you really respect each others opinions. You don't raise your voices and let others to finish their

## COMMITTEE D AND THE RESOLUTION PHENOMENON

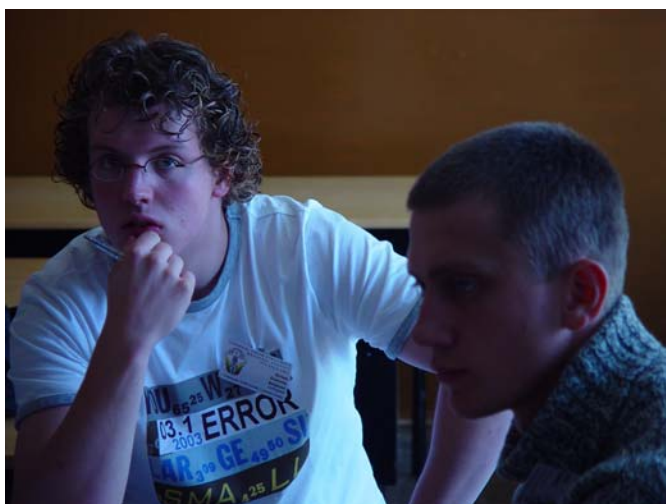

Ance (LV) she just have a common sense, it is great! She kept silence, but when she began telling, there were very good ideas. The chair wants to thank you, my dear!

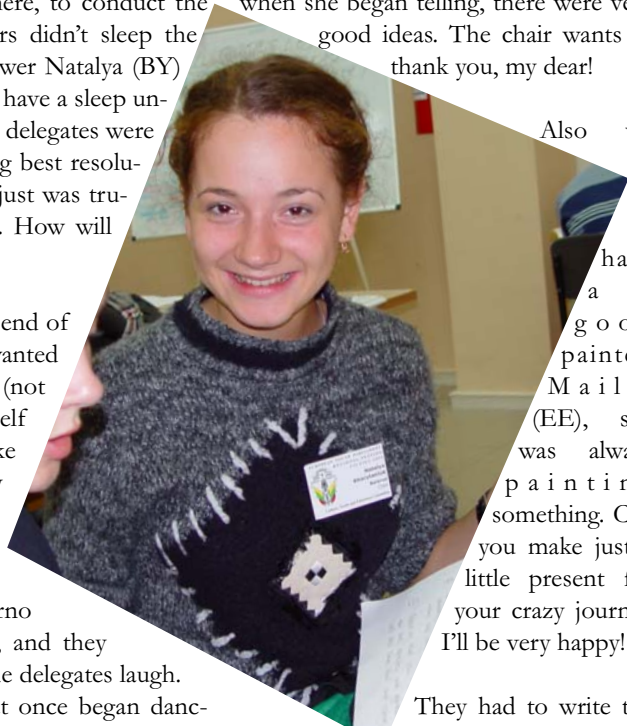
Also we have a good painter, Mailis (EE), she was always painting something. Can you make just a little present for your crazy journo? I`ll be very happy!

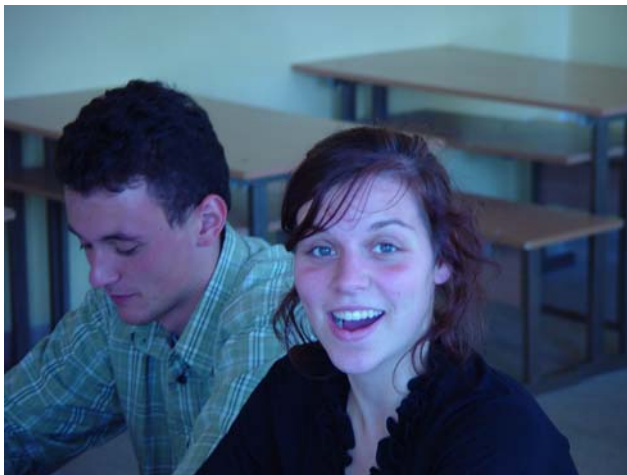

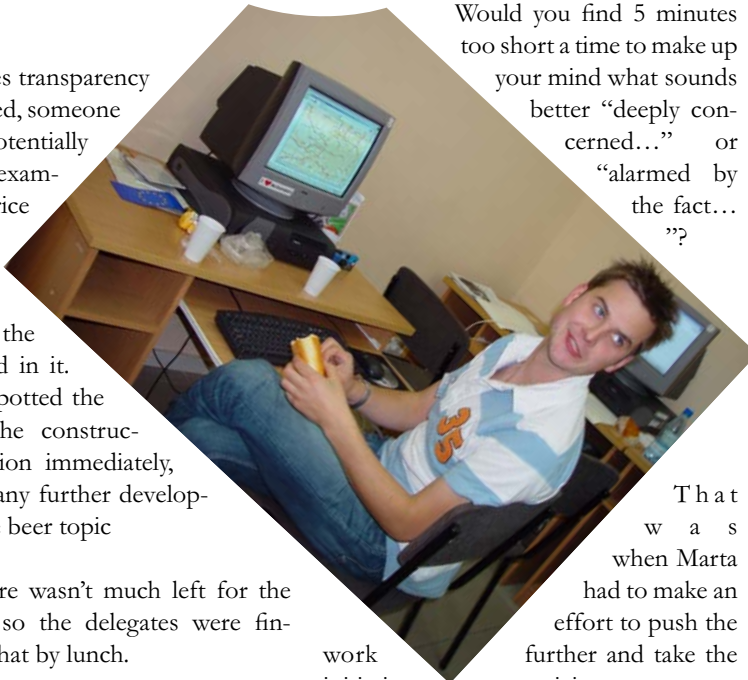

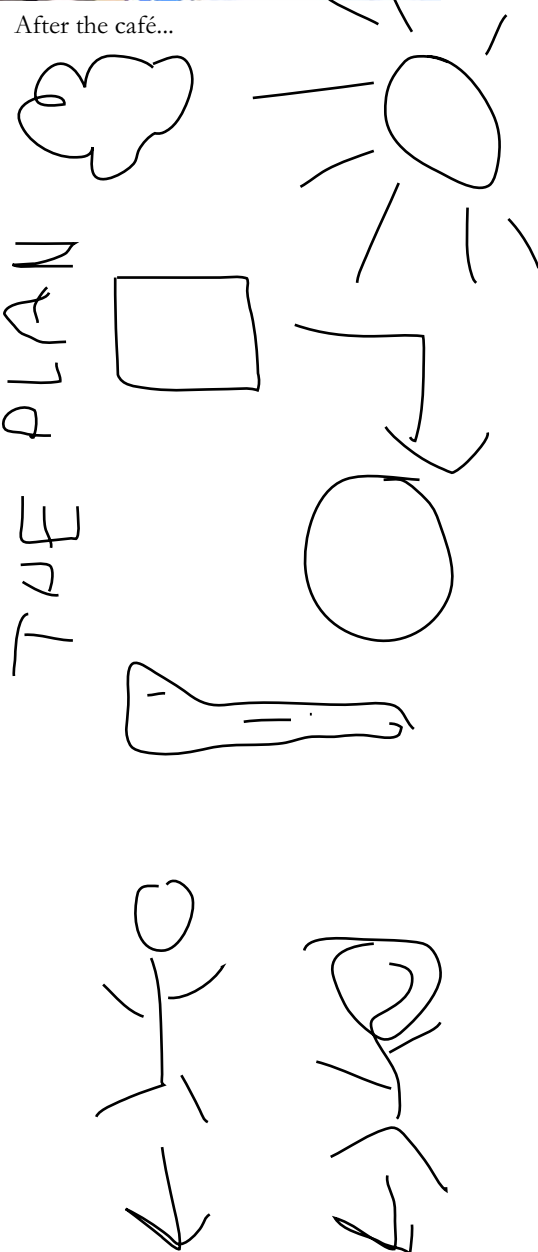

## EYP CAFÉ GOSSIP



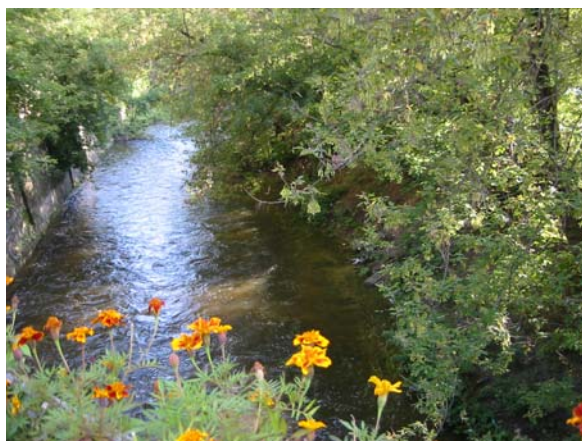
Some EYP café “activities” a.k.a. Has the visit to the bar lit the flame in EY-Pers?
